Keeping you informed Traffic Management

18 October, 2018

Additional traffic lights are now in place on Caldene Avenue. This is to facilitate work being carried out by Yorkshire Water at the junction of Caldene Avenue and Burnley Road as part of the Mytholmroyd Flood Alleviation Scheme.

Three way lights will be in place until the middle of next week. Following this, from Friday 26th, the traffic management along Burnley Road will be extended further along the road for one week, as work is carried out by the Co-op.

You may experience slightly longer journey times through the village during these times, but we will continue to work closely with Calderdale Council Highways and utilise the Bluetooth technology to manage the traffic flows.

The pedestrian crossings will not be affected by these traffic management changes and the assisted crossing will remain operational.

We appreciate that traffic disruption is inconvenient and would like to thank you for continued patience and understanding whilst we make these adjustments.
