
## Keeping you informed Traffic Management

12 February 2019

Additional traffic management will be in place next week along the A646 Burnley Road to complete concreting work between the river wall and new parapet wall (shown in the diagram). To facilitate this activity, we will need to close one lane of this section of the road to allow space for machinery and a safe working area.

This work is planned to be carried out outside peak traffic times, but will require two-way lights to be in place over five days from **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> February to Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> February** (during the school half term break). The traffic lights will be operational from 9.30am each day and removed again at 3.30pm.

This means that the pedestrian crossing by Grange Dean/New Road will not be operational at this time and there will be no automated crossing point in the village during the work. **A crossing attendant will however, be available to assist pedestrians crossing the road at this location.**



You may experience increased travel times through the village whilst we carry out this work. We understand the frustration that any delay causes and appreciate your continued patience both as road users and pedestrians during this short phase of essential activity in the village. Our traffic management operatives will continue to manage the traffic flows and endeavour to keep any further delays to a minimum. Please take extra care, look out for our signage and always cross at the manned pedestrian crossing.
